- The Construction Industry could see increased growth in many Occupations should the Federal Government pass an Infrastructure Bill.

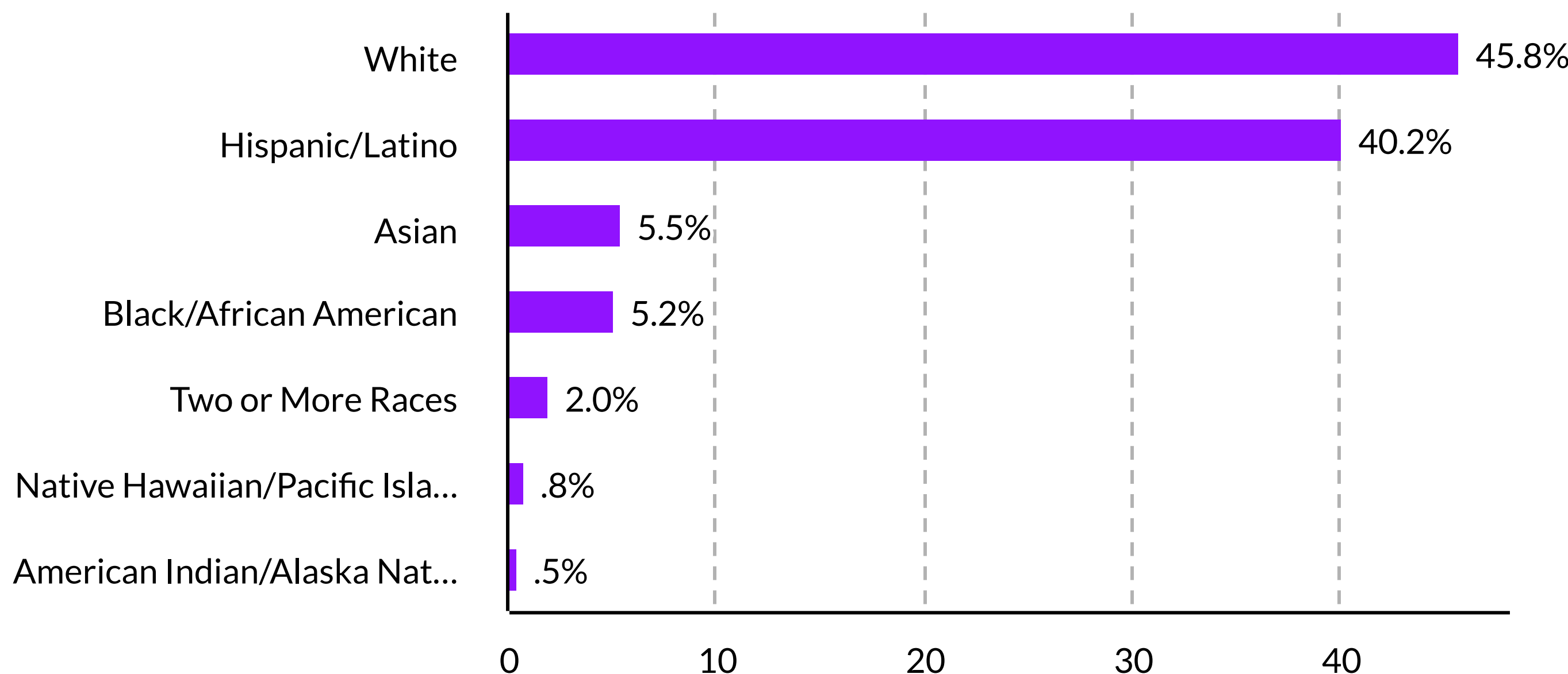

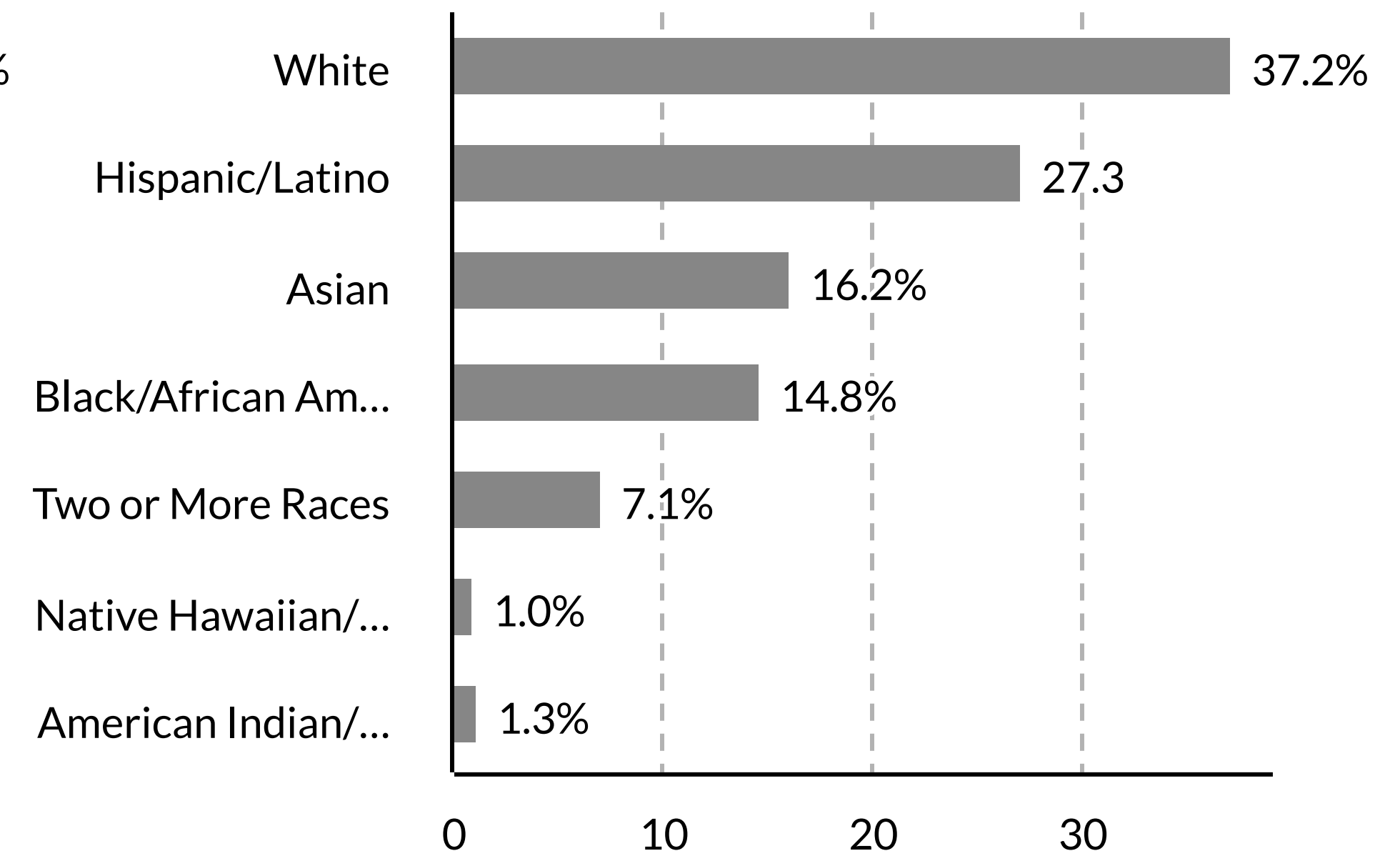

Industry Race/Ethnicity Breakdown

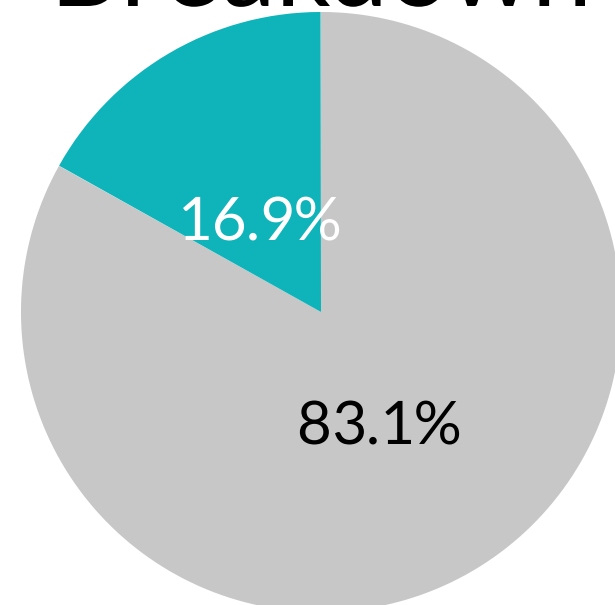


Solano County Breakdown

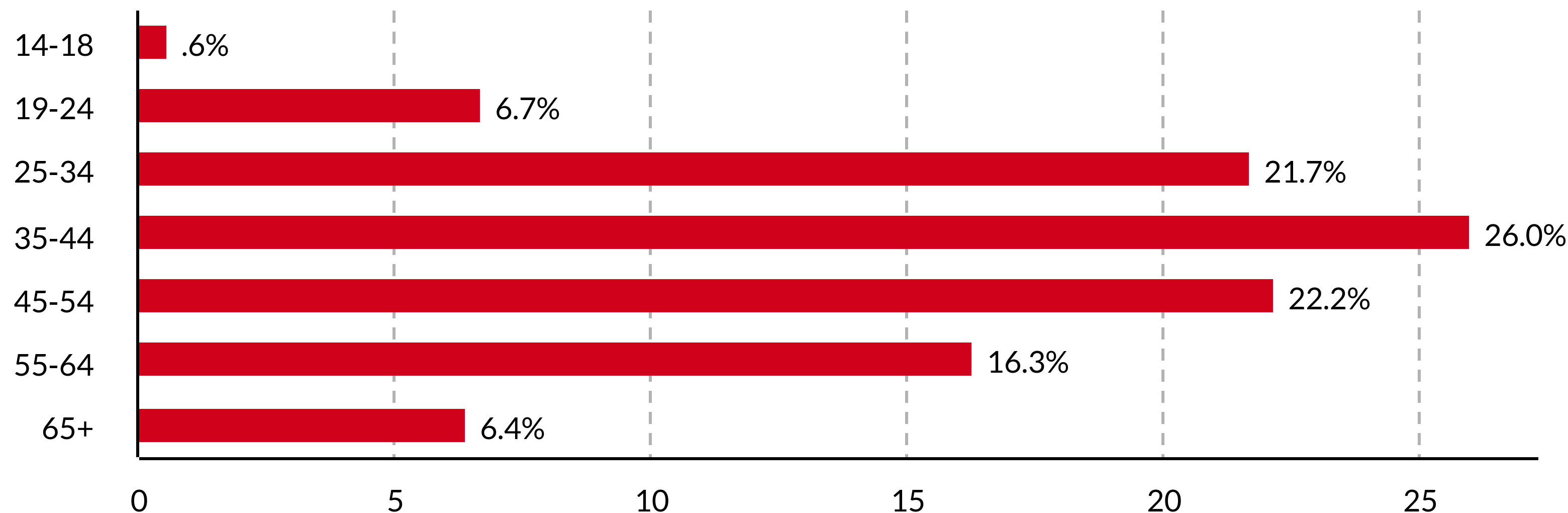
Industry Gender Breakdown
