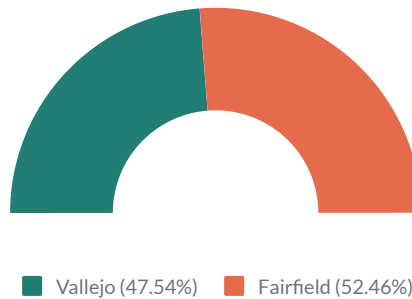
The America's Job Centers of California (AJCC) consists of partners who operate the job centers include Employment Development Department, the WDB, Division of Rehabilitation, and others.

JOB CENTER TRAFFIC BY LOCATION



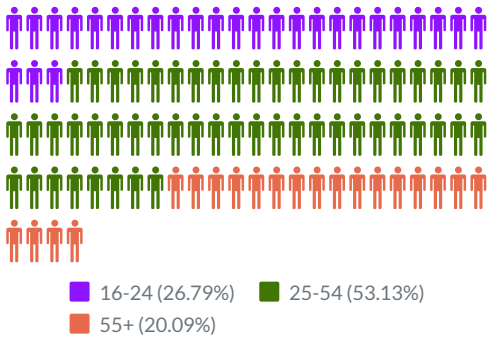
Work Experience

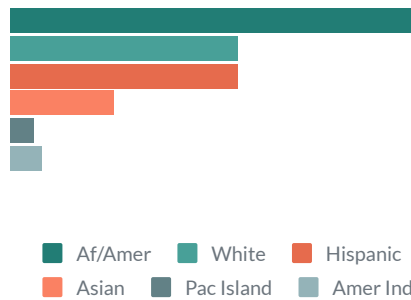
Job Seeker Demographics

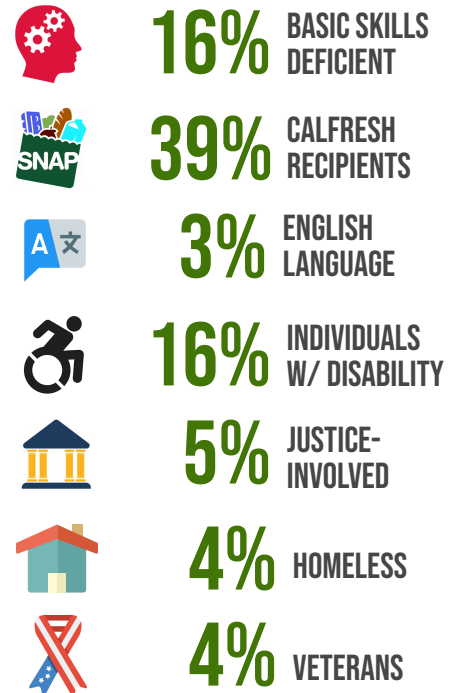

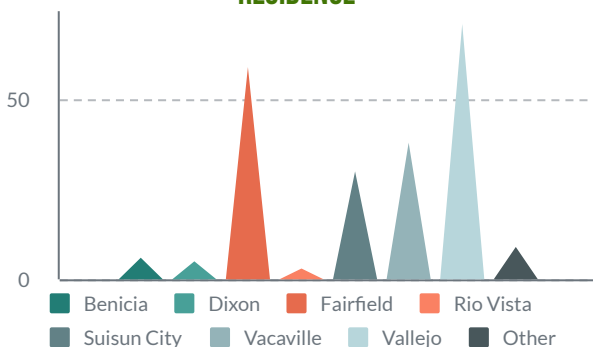
RACE/ETHNICITY



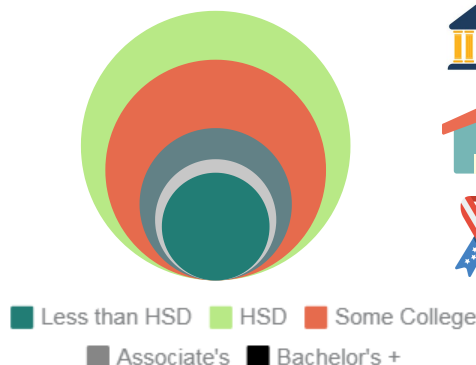
PRIORITY POPULATIONS

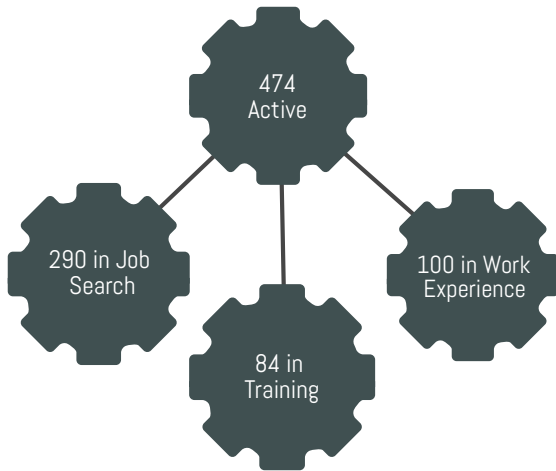




Intensive Services

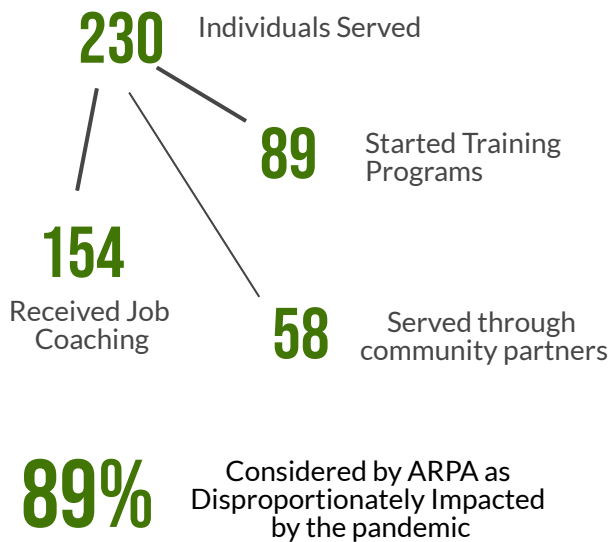
