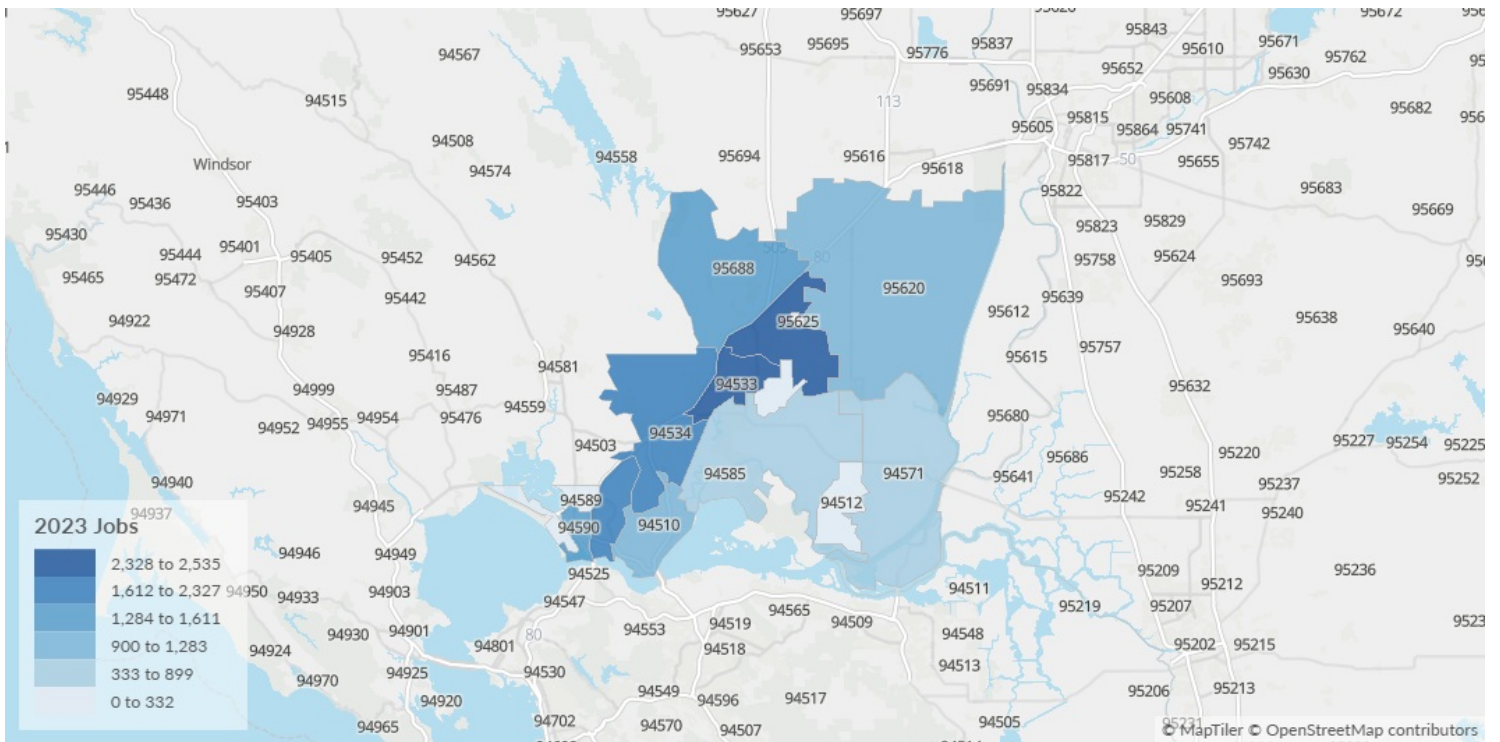

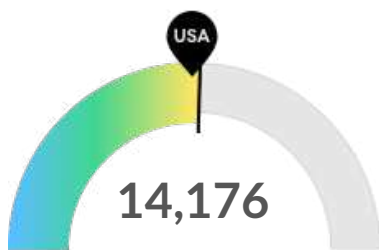

Aggressive Hiring Competition Over an Average Supply of Regional Talent



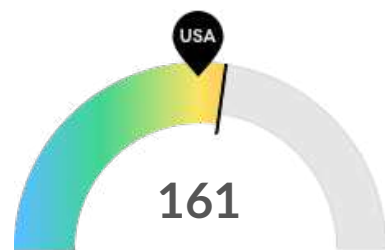
Supply (Jobs)

Solano County, CA is about average for this kind of talent. The national average for an area this size is 13,751* employees, while there are 14,176 here.



Earnings Per Job

Demand (Job Postings)

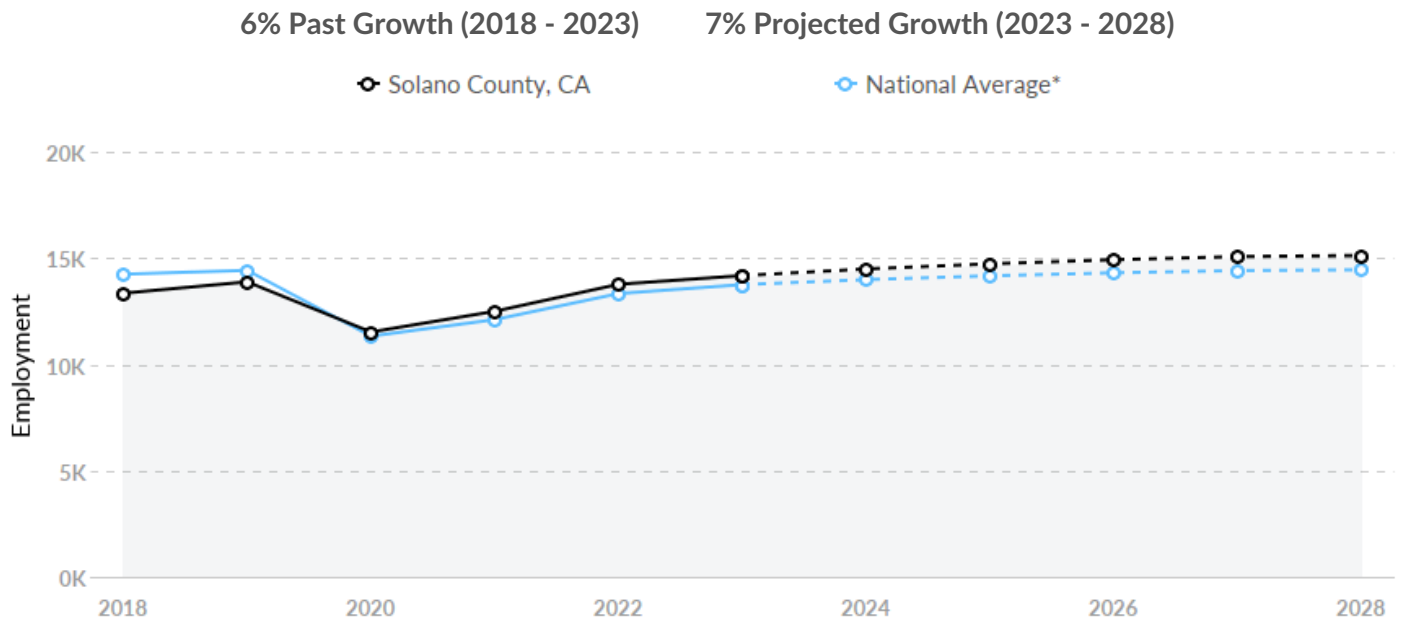
Competition from online job postings is high in Solano County, CA. The national average for an area this size is 141* job postings/mo, while there are 161 here.

Supply (Jobs)

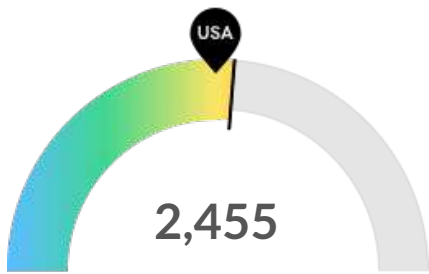
Supply Is About Equal to the National Average

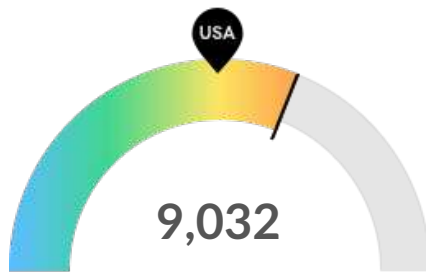

Retirement Risk Is About Average, While Overall Diversity Is High



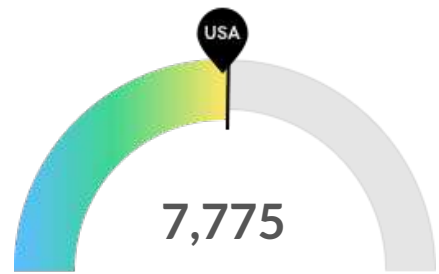
Retiring Soon

Racial diversity is high in Solano County, CA. The national average for an area this size is 6,452* racially diverse employees, while there are 9,032 here.



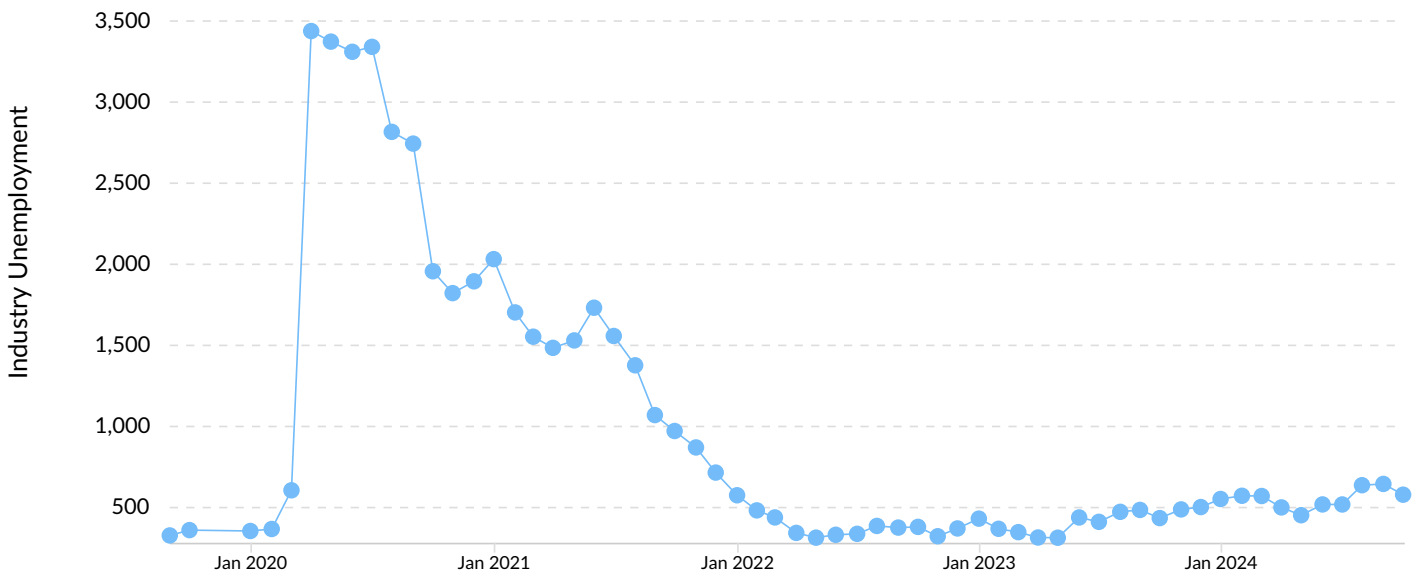
Gender Diversity

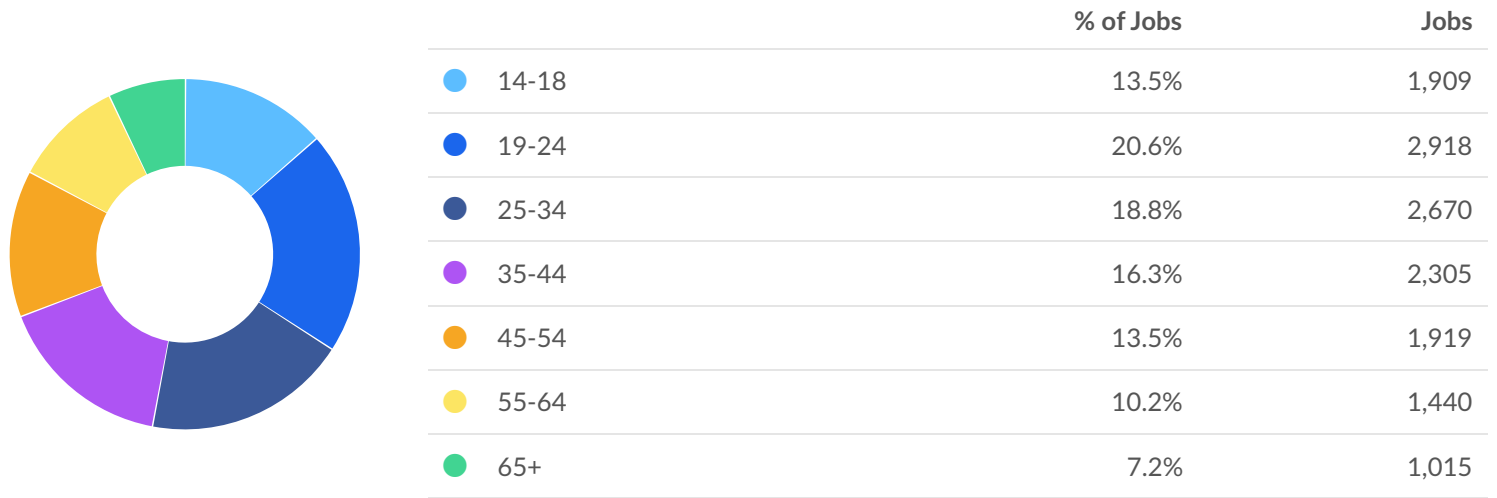
Unemployment Rate Trends

Unemployment shown at the 2-digit sector level.

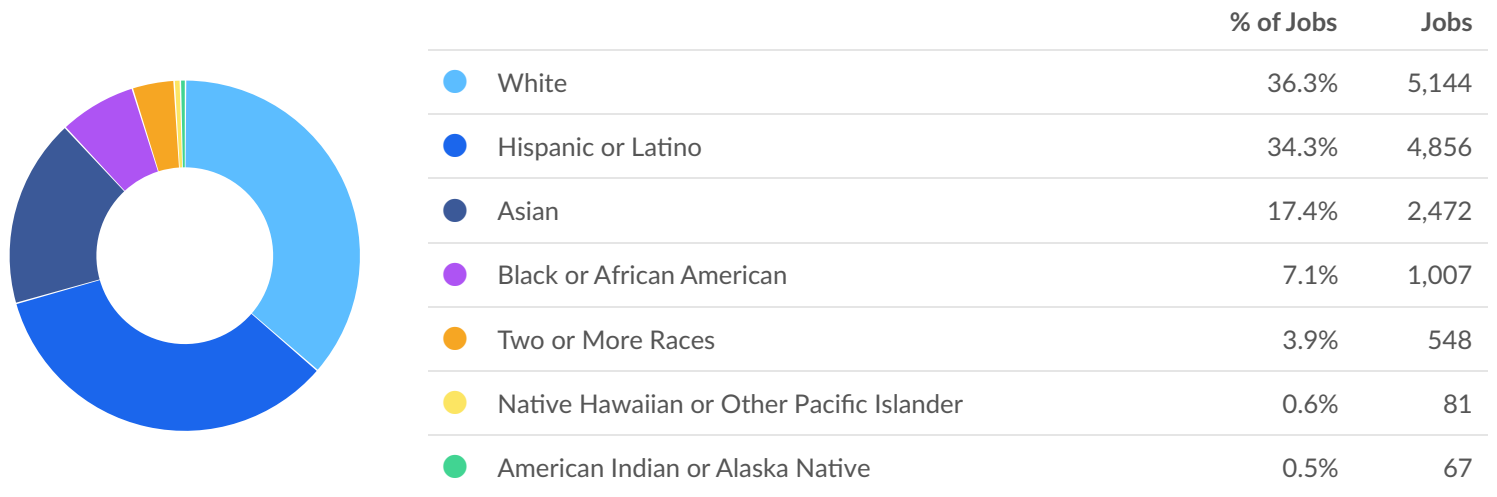

Industry Race/Ethnicity Breakdown

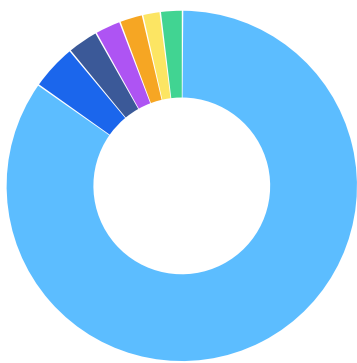

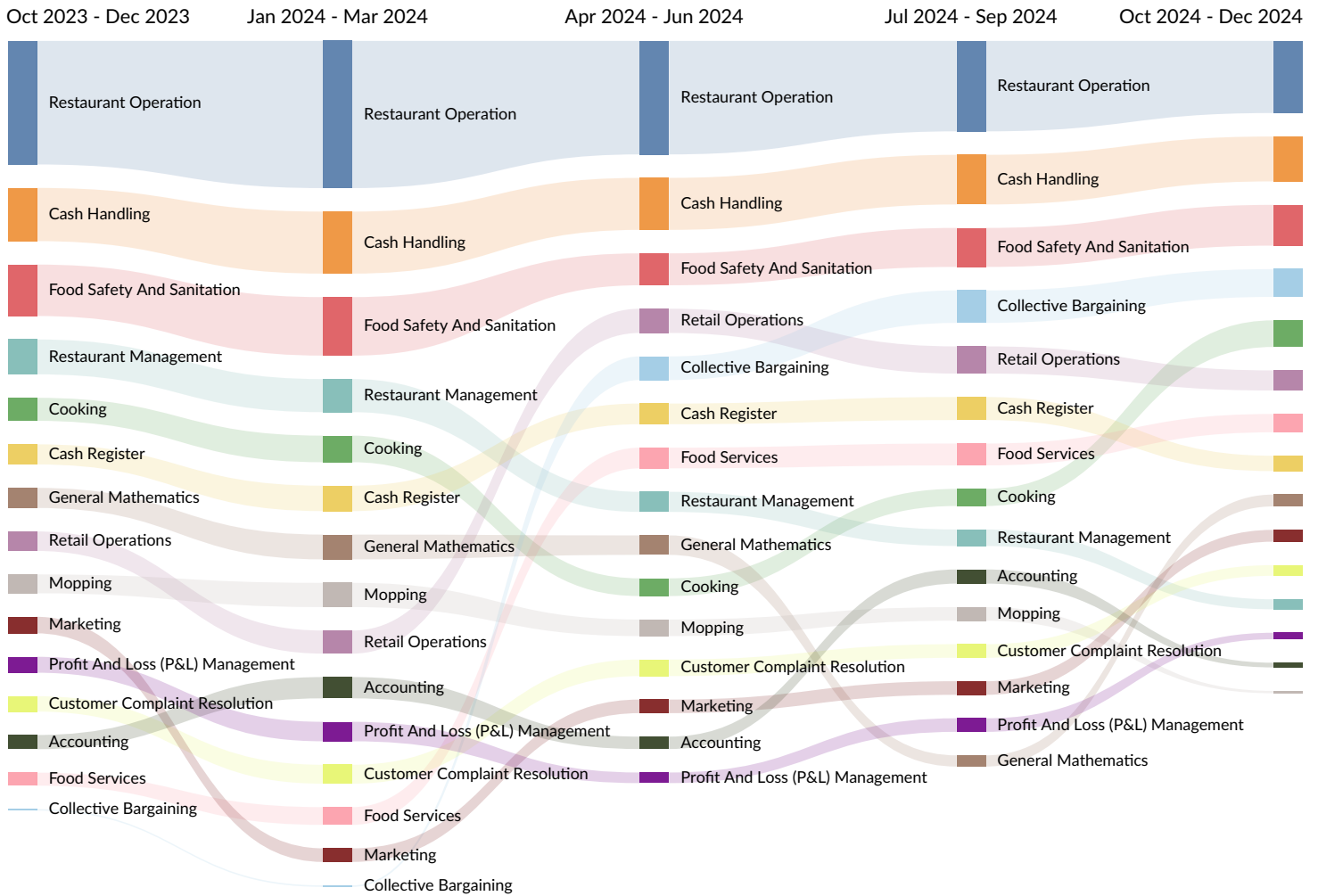
