

## Aggressive Hiring Competition Over a Deep Supply of Regional Talent




#### Supply (Jobs)

Solano County, CA is a hotspot for this kind of talent. The national average for an area this size is 21,526\* employees, while there are 28,214 here.



#### **Earnings Per Job**

Earnings per job are above the national average. Earnings per jobs is the total industry earnings divided by the number of jobs in the industry.



#### **Demand (Job Postings)**

Competition from online job postings is high in Solano County, CA. The national average for an area this size is 429\* job postings/mo, while there are 523 here.



## Supply Is Higher Than the National Average








#### **Racial Diversity**


Racial diversity is high in Solano County, CA. The national average for an area this size is 12,420\* racially diverse employees, while there are 19,551 here.

Unemployment shown at the 2-digit sector level.




