Job Seeker Demographics

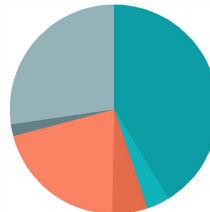

RACE/ETHNICITY



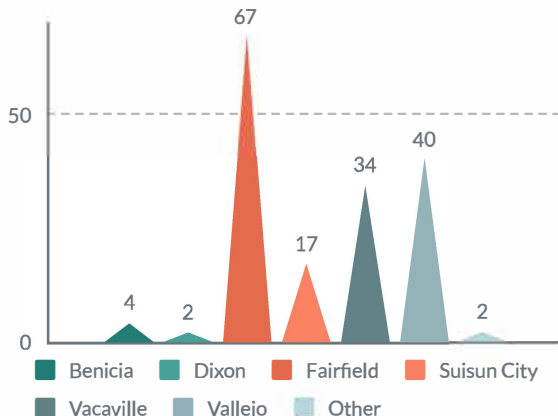

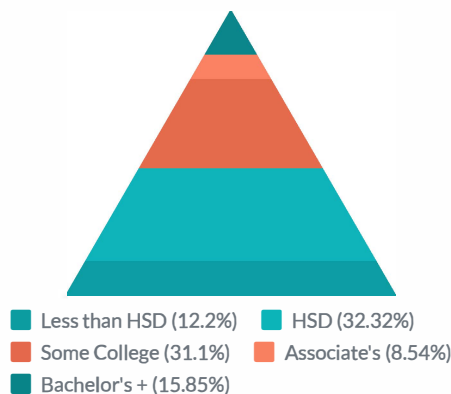
